About the School and location

Wisbech Grammar School (WGS) is an independent, co-educational school located near the centre of the historic town of Wisbech in Cambridgeshire, on a green site of 44 acres beside the River Nene which runs through the town. The School offers a broad, high-quality education with excellent pastoral care for around 590 children aged 2-18. It is predominantly a day School but, in recent years, has started to take a limited number of boarders, mainly from the Far East.

The School is located on a single site with Wisbech Grammar Preparatory School (formerly known as Magdalene House) and the Senior School sharing the same buildings and extensive playing fields. The Kindergarten was established in 2018.

Wisbech is a historic market town with a royal charter in north Cambridgeshire and it straddles the River Nene, roughly halfway between Peterborough and King's Lynn. The town has a population of just over 30,000 and there are good road links to Cambridge, Norwich, Peterborough and the North Norfolk Coast.

There are five Core Sports at WGS; Rugby, Hockey, Netball, Cricket and Athletics with teams regularly playing from U9 to our School 1st teams (U18). Senior School Matches are played every Saturday, with some midweek matches and Sunday tournaments. Prep School matches are mostly played on a Wednesday afternoon, although there are some weekend fixtures.

The Head of Performance, Coaching and Athletic Development (PC&AD) will oversee the Performance and Coaching of core sports at WGS as well as the Athletic Development of our athletes. They will be responsible to the Assistant Head Sport, Co-curricular and Partnerships

This will include

- oversight of Heads of Sport in relation to the teaching and coaching plans for each sport.
- supporting our coaches across all sports to develop coaching throughout the school including watching teams and training sessions when their schedule allows them to do so.
- working with pupils on our Talented Athlete Pathway and with Sports Scholarships liaising closely with the School Physio and S&C coach.
- mentoring the talented young coaches who have joined us to further their development.
- coaching a specific sport and helping with other sports during the year.

There is also the opportunity for the right candidate to become involved in elements of the wider wellbeing programme, as well as contributing to the Prep School PE programme, delivering the WIPP activities (Working in Partnership Programme with local primary schools) or any other areas of this busy day and boarding school.

Job Description

Principle Role

Under the direction of the Assistant Head Sport, we are looking for a dynamic, forward thinking and committed Coach, with excellent administration and communication skills to take on this new position and take our sport programme forward.

The Head of Performance, Coaching and Athletic Development (PC&AD) will be responsible for the development of Performance and Coaching in the Core Sports Programmes throughout the Prep and Senior School. They oversee the planning and implementation of termly coaching programs in the core sports and will mentor coaches as needed. They will also have responsibility for the Athletic Development of our young players on our Talented Athlete Pathway (including our Sports Scholars)

They will also have responsibility for coaching and managing their own teams across all 3 terms, ensuring sessions are planned and implemented and taking them to all fixtures if not involved in Elite level Sport at that time.

Detailed Role

Specific Head of Performance, Coaching and Athletic Development role

- 1. Overseeing all departmental schemes of work
- 2. Quality assuring the planning and delivery of training sessions
- 3. Holding weekly coaches' meetings and match debriefs with coaches
- 4. Overseeing the development of Sport across the school, including Coach CPD.
- 5. Developing and leading the talented athlete pathway
- 6. Overseeing Athletic testing, rehabilitation and return to sport sessions with the school physio and S&C coach
- 7. Completing half termly reports for the Assistant Head Sport and Headmaster
- 8. Promoting a high profile for sport
- 9. Ensuring a quality experience for both girls and boys

Standard Coach Role

- 1. Planning and delivering high quality, safe and enjoyable sports sessions
- 2. Ensuring pupil's behaviour and attitudes are appropriate
 - Work alongside the Assistant Head Sport and Heads of Sport in having high expectations of pupils' behaviour and attitude and ensuring standards remain high when training, as well as when preparing/travelling for matches and throughout school fixtures.
 - This includes promoting team spirit and enjoyment.
 - Contributing to the educational ethos and values of the school; encouraging participation and enjoyment in all sports by all pupils as well as pursuing sporting excellence
- 3. Ensuring effective fixtures:
 - Leading and preparing teams for matches and tournaments (where applicable) and refereeing/umpiring matches as appropriate.
 - Nominating candidates for captaining teams to the Assistant Head Sport
 - Selecting teams to play in inter school fixtures and tournaments.
 - Publishing team sheets on the school sports website (SOCS) (ICT competence required).
 - Organising relevant equipment when taking teams to away matches
 - Providing match reports on each school fixture and seeing that these are published on the website.

- with pupils to ensure progression, improvement and understanding (including any questions/changes to team selection and fixtures).
- with parents regarding team selection and fixtures
- with Heads of Sport regarding pupils' progress, improvement, team selection, fixtures,

5. Other duties

- Fulfilling supervisory duties before and after sports sessions and fixtures.
- Nominating pupils for colours, awards and Scholarships to the Assistant Head Sport
- Any other tasks of a similar nature which might reasonably be requested by the Senior Team.
